
Debbie started meeting, she greeted new people and talked about what CIT committee is all about. Business people and community college folks in attendance.

2. APPROVAL of Meeting Minutes

- a. Debbie talked about how the minutes are posted online and urged the committee to go over the minutes and make sure everything looks ok for final draft.
- b. Tom asked if anyone had anything to add to the minutes, no comments, meeting minutes were approved from the December meeting.
- c. Deb talked about how it would be nice to have the right members from the community colleges to be part of the CIT group meetings so when we look at activities such as going to SCC or SFCC we have the right people on board to plan that.

3. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

- a. Grant or Scholarship for students who are going into trades. It is just for the valley students, not many applicants and lots of money out there. March 29th is the new deadline. Tim from SCC added students must have at least 1 CTE course in high school in order to apply.

4. NEW BUSINESS

- a. Debbie is going over the training that is used by lots of different groups. You are going to be in groups so you have 1, 1, then 2 or 3 in the back row. You will need paper and pen. The simulation they are working on is called the airplane simulation. The group was split up into 3 different 4-5 group teams.
- b. Groups A, B, and C was asked if they have an answer. All groups responded NO
- c. Debbie handed out some new information to the 3 groups. She gave them a few minutes to go over the directions without talking. She is now letting her groups talk and try and figure out.

- d. The idea of this activity is that 1 person in the front had all the information but couldn't communicate it with people in the back. The message is that if one person has all the information and doesn't communicate it nothing gets done. This ties into our groups because with teachers and our business leaders sometimes it is hard to get the information from the business leaders if they are sitting in the front and we aren't asking the right questions. If the teachers are sitting in the back and not asking questions about what is going on in the industry or asking for help.
- e. Deb talks about the importance of having all the right members in the group making sure that the time we are spending is productive for everyone.
- f. Next activity, working with kids in school to have an idea of what they can do after school. College, work, trade school ect... In small groups give 10 responses to what is going well with Communication and IT world.

Group B (Community Colleges)

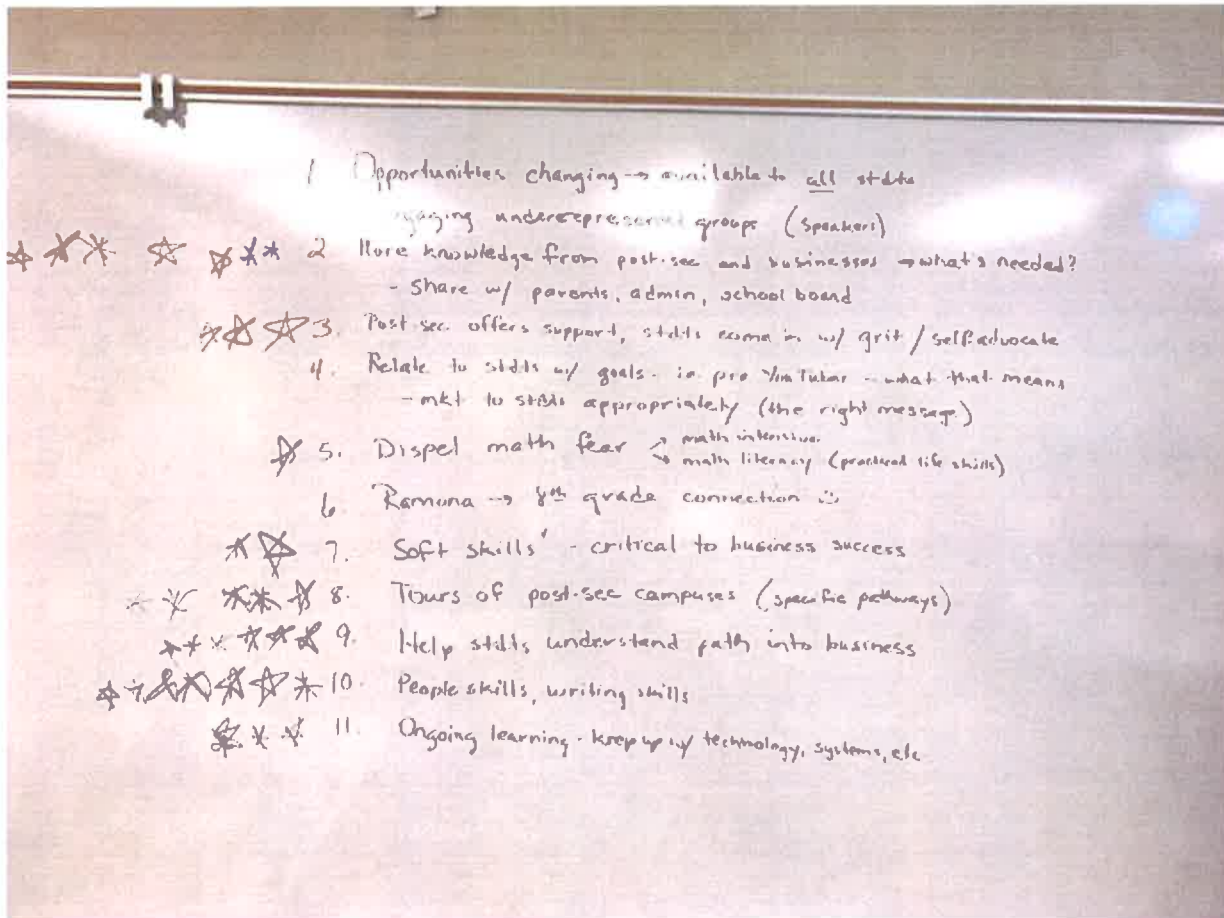
