WSU Medical School (Ken Roberts)

- Interested in partnering to develop a pipeline of students to the medical field in Spokane
- Nursing, Pharmacy, College of Medicine
- Working with GSI to develop a workshop
- To be competitive for WSU's Medical School
 - Holistic admissions process (students must clear academic bars BUT admission is not directly based on Grades and MCATs – not shared with admissions committee)
 - Mission and goals and how well they are aligned with WSU Medical School
 - Really look carefully at the candidate
 - Shadowing a physician is a MUST
- Campus offers many opportunities to visit campus – contact Ken Roberts or call 509-358-7823 or the Chancellor's office
 - They will also come and visit schools to talk to students, teachers, and guidance counselors
- Admission – started with a class of 60 students; target is 80 with growth potential of 250 students
 - Only take WA state residents

Review Program of Work

- Were able to have business member presentations regarding top 5 in-demand careers
 - Brandy Tarala had a great time as a guest speaker with AMR at WVHS
 - Important for students to see the ambulance environment in real life and to hear about the difference between paramedics and EMTs
- Career connected learning Prezi presentation
- Free-standing Emergency Department video – not going to pursue
- Sacred Heart Medical Center Emergency Room and Simulation lab tour – 23 kids attended
- SCC health science program tour – very receptive; several groups of kids toured
- Recruitment of business/industry members – continue as needed

Ideas for 2018-2019 program of work

- Continue to include top 5 in-demand careers
- Continue classroom visits from business members as guest speakers
 - Set up specific dates (at the beginning of next year) for field trips, guest speakers, etc.
 - Continue Sacred Heart Medical Center Emergency Room and Simulation lab tour
 - Continue SCC health science program tour
 - Continue recruitment of business/industry members
 - WSU Medical School Virtual Lab Tour
 - How do we weave in “soft” skills intentionally?
 - Could include at the end of Top 5 In-Demand Careers
 - Teachers share lessons/activities
 - Students present and model skills for the committee
- When students are present, can we have business and industry outline volunteer opportunities, etc. for students
- How can we work with CHAS Health to funnel our health science students to their programs/apprenticeships?
- Middle school lens
 - Bringing business into the classroom with specifically interested students

- Serve Washington and Idaho with a variety of health care needs including behavioral health and dental services
- Accept patients regardless of insurance status; operate on a sliding scale
- Growing by approximately 10,000 patients per year
- Opened up a Nurse Practitioner Residency Clinic in Spokane Valley – host a lot of students for more on-the-job training; fully salaried and benefited
 - 12 month program for fully licensed Nurse Practitioners
 - Graduating their first class this summer of 3 people
- Expanding more locations for Dental Care
- Partnering with Providence for Dental Residency
- Opening a Geriatric Clinic
- CHAS Health works with all local colleges and programs to get students into complete their rotation hours
 - Hosting students from Health Information Technology Management through medical school/physicians
